### **COUNSELLING**

#### & GUIDANCE CELL

The Counselling and Guidance Cell provides a supportive, friendly and empathetic environment to the students. The Cell caters to academic, behavioural and personality problems of the students from Kindergarten to Class XII. Guidance is provided to the students with special educational needs as well. Career Guidance is also provided to senior students.

#### **SCHEME OF STUDIES**

The school is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi under the 10+2 pattern and is recognized by the Supreme Education Council, State of Qatar. The school follows the curriculum, syllabi and textbooks prescribed by the CBSE for all its classes. Qualifying examinations are held at the end of Class X and XII.

Medium of Instruction: English, which is also the first language taught at the School.

**Second Languages**: (any one of the following from Classes I to X)

Arabic, French, Hindi, Urdu, Malayalam and Tamil. Indian Students to preferably opt for ONLY INDIAN LANGUAGE.

Third Languages: (any one of the following from Classes IV to VIII)

Note: For the Indian students Hindi must be either a second or third language.

KG classes adopt play-way and activity-oriented approach with emphasis on the improvement of speaking, reading and writing skills.

### KG II

#### Classes I to IV

English, Second Language, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Qatar History, Art & Craft, General Knowledge, Holy Quran / Dance, Islamic Studies / Moral Science, Music, Physical Education and Work Experience (Computer Science) and Third Language (only for Class IV)

#### Classes V to VIII

English, Second Language, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Qatar History, Third Language, Art, Islamic Studies / Moral Science, Physical Education, Dance, Music, Environmental Studies,

Work Experience (Computer Science), Co-curricular activities (General Knowledge, Maths Quiz and Creative Writing).

Note: Participation in Work Experience, Physical Education and Co-curricular Activities (General Knowledge, General Studies, Environmental Studies and Creative Writing) is compulsory for Class XI & XII and will be graded as per the requirement of CBSE. Evaluation will be based on observational methods assessing students' interest, attitude & projects on continuous basis. These activities will be done only during the Second Term as we utilise the First Term for syllabus coverage of Core Subjects.

#### **ASSESSMENT & EVALUATION**

Regular tests and examinations are conducted which includes weekly tests, class tests, Unit tests and Periodic Tests to facilitate Internal Assessment of each student's progress through the year. Each academic year will have two Periodic Tests (Classes I to VIII), two Periodic Tests (Class IX & X), regular weekly tests, Term-1 Examination and Annual Examination. Promotion to the next class depends on the marks obtained from the cumulative result at the end of the academic year / Annual

Examination. Students are informed well in advance regarding all the tests and examination. Mark Cards will be issued after the Periodic Tests. Report Card will be issued after the Final Examination.

Examinations and Evaluation are subject to change as per the recommendations given by CBSE.

### LIBRARY RULES

- 1. No student shall engage himself/herself in audible conversation inside the library. Perfect silence and order must be maintained.
- 2. Students are not allowed to bring in anything other than library books borrowed earlier, pencil/pen and a note book/diary.
- 3. While in the reading room, students can select one book at a time from any section. (They should place it on the table before going back to their classes).
- 4. Students shall handle the books carefully. Any damage done to the books will have to be made good by the student who borrows it.
- 5. Dog-earing, writing, mutilating or removal of illustrations, diagrams, pictures etc. are serious offences.
- 6. The library will remain open on all working days.
- 7. At a time, only one book will be issued to the students of Class V and above during their library periods.
- 8. The library books are issued for a period of seven days only. They may be renewed for further seven days if no other student has demanded them.
- 9. Students must check the books carefully before borrowing them and report to the librarian on the spot if they find any book damaged, or they will be held responsible for the same.
- 10. Reference books are meant for reading in the library only.
- 11. Any book lost has to be replaced or fine will be levied as notified below:
  - a) Present cost of the book.
  - b) Qrs. 10/- as postage and binding charges.
  - c) 15% of the cost of the book as fine.
- 12. If the books are not returned on the due date, fine will be levied as per the following rates:

a) First seven days : QR. 2/b) Eighth day onwards : Qrs. 5/-

13. All books must be returned to the library at least one week before the terminal / final examination. No student will be permitted to sit for the examination without obtaining "No Dues" from the library.

- 14. The library has an open access system. Students are instructed not to disturb the sequence of the books on the shelves.
- 15. The library provides reprographic service at the rate of Qr. 0.50/- dirhams / per copy. This service will be available for girls on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday (until recess) and for boys on Tuesday (after recess), Wednesday and Thursday.

#### LABORATORIES:

There are spacious laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Engineering Graphics, Computer Science (additional for Junior Section) and Home Science (for girls only). All the labs are well equipped as per the CBSE guidelines.

#### **EDUCATIONAL EXCURSIONS AND GUEST LECTURES:**

The school organises the following field trips as part of EDUCATIONAL EXCURSION for different classes.

To Museum, Zoo, Botanical Gardens, Planetarium, Industrial Establishments like QAPCO, NODCO, and QASCO etc. Such visits enable the children to learn from the environment around them. Study tours to other countries are arranged for the Senior Classes.

Guest lectures are organised from time to time and experts in various fields are invited to enlighten the students in their respective fields of expertise.

#### SPECIAL COACHING FACILITIES:

The school has a spacious playground. Coaching is given in Football, Cricket, Handball, Volleyball, Basketball, Athletics, Tennis, Table Tennis, Martial Arts etc. During summer and winter vacations, the school organises constructive academic and remedial classes in addition to coaching in games and sports, calligraphy etc. Sports and Music coaching classes are organised in the evenings from time to time throughout the year.

#### **SCHOOL MAGAZINE:**

The school publishes its Magazine 'IDEALITE' once in two years. 'IDEALITE' depicts the creative talents of the students as well as highlights their achievements. It also portrays various events and co-curricular activities held throughout the year. Students form an integral part of the Editorial Board. Each Section publishes Newsletter every term, highlighting the activities and achievements. It is available on the school website. The First Edition of Students' newsletter - 'Chronicle,' is uploaded on the school website.

### **TRANSPORT:**

The school owns 39 air-conditioned buses and hires 63 others, which ply between different areas and the school. The transportation fee is collected along with the monthly tuition fees. Students who opt for this facility have to avail it throughout the year. Bus stops are fixed after thorough survey of the situation and any future request for a change would be considered only on valid grounds acceptable to the school.

Transport fee is payable in advance with the terminal / bimonthly / monthly tuition fees and transport cards are to be revalidated.

N.B. Fees once paid will not be refunded. Bus Pass is to be produced whenever demanded by the School authorities.

#### TRANSPORT RULES

- 1. The school Transport will be provided subject to availability of buses and seats depending upon the accessibility and distance from the school.
- 2. Complete address and mobile number to be provided to the Transport Coordinator. Change of address should be intimated immediately and availability of the seats to be confirmed.
- 3. Students will be allowed to use only the allotted bus and the pickup point. No change will be allowed without prior written permission from the school.
- 4. Parents are requested not to board the school buses, or argue with the teachers, driver or conductors in the bus. Written complaints or problems if any, can be handed over to the transport in-charge.
- 5. Students should reach the pickup point five minutes before the schedule time, students should also board the bus immediately after the school gets over. Buses will not wait for late comers.
- 6. All students should occupy the seats immediately after boarding the buses. They should not move around in the bus when in motion.
- 7. Students should not put their heads or hands out of the window. No trash should be thrown inside or outside the bus.
- 8. Unruly behavior is strictly prohibited.
- 9. Students will be responsible for any damage caused by their negligence. Their bus service will be discontinued without further notice.
- 10. Parents of KG and Junior classes have to ensure that their wards do not go to and from the bus unescorted.
- 11. The driver's attention must not be diverted for any reason.
- 12. Transport fees should be paid on time.

#### PARENTS PLEASE NOTE

Parents are requested to

- 1. Ensure that children are provided with prescribed books, student's diary and proper uniform.
- 2. Ensure that children come to school regularly and punctually. They must wear the uniform prescribed by the school and must look neat and tidy. Boys in particular, should have proper haircut.
- 3. Keep constant watch on the academic performance of children and ensure development of positive attitude and undivided attention towards studies. This will be of great help to us in bringing up your child.
- 4. Refrain from remarks which undermine the position of the school and the teachers in the presence of the child. Parents are most welcome to approach the Principal with their opinions and suggestions during the visiting hours.

- 5. Establish contact with teachers of their wards to satisfy themselves about the progress and general behavior of their children. However, they are not expected to contact them over phone or enter their classrooms during school hours. If it is urgent, they should contact the concerned Head of the Section.
- 6. Respond to the reports and information sent to them from the school.
- 7. Ensure that fees and other school dues are cleared on or before the due dates.
- 8. Send leave application for their ward's absence duly signed either beforehand or on joining the school. Application for medical leave should be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- 9. Note that if a student stays away from school without proper leave application or information for more than 15 days continuously, his or her name will be struck off the rolls. Such pupils will be re-admitted only on payment of re-admission charge of Qrs. 150/-. Re-admission is, however, subject to availability of seats.
- 10. Note that no leave will be granted during Unit Tests / Examinations except on medical grounds.
- 11. Note that students with irregular attendance, habitual carelessness, disobedience or improper conduct, justify dismissal from School.
- 12. Note that all the students are responsible for the School property and accountable to the school for their behavior, both, within and outside the School. Any reported misbehavior or misconduct in the School on the part of a student shall make the student liable for disciplinary action leading to removal of name from the School Register.
- 13. Note that students suffering from infectious or contagious diseases like chicken pox, measles, mumps, conjunctivitis etc. should not be sent to School.
- 14. Note that the School does not accept any responsibility or liability what so ever for any accident that may happen or any disease that may be transmitted by a student either in the school or while travelling to and from the school or on any other occasion. Parents sending their children to School, do so entirely at their own risk.
- 15. Kindly co-operate for the smooth running of the School. Your valuable feedback, advice and suggestions are always welcome.
- 16. Please update your contact numbers and address change, if any, as and when there is a change with the concerned Head of Sections.

#### SCHOOL'S CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. It is compulsory that students come to School in the prescribed uniform, proper haircut and nail cut. Any irregularity should be accompanied by a note from the parent justifying the same. Students who do not come in proper uniform, haircut will not be permitted to attend the class.
- 2. Every pupil must possess the Student's Diary, which must be brought to School every day. Parents should check the Diary regularly and sign the remarks given by the teachers. Failure to do so will result in the child being sent home.

- 3. In all events, a student should behave in proper, cordial and acceptable manner. Any objectionable behavior is liable to disciplinary action.
- 4. Students should reach the School on time and should attend the morning assembly on all working days including examination days.
- 5. Regular attendance, obedience, cleanliness, politeness, courtesy in speech and conduct are expected from every pupil.
- 6. Students found possessing tobacco, alcoholic beverages and any other harmful products will be dealt seriously.
- 7. Students are expected to take care of their bags, books and other belongings.
- 8. No student shall leave the School premises during school hours without the written permission of the Section in Charge/Principal.
- 9. Students are forbidden from bringing electronic gadgets such as mobile phones, i-pads, tablets, valuable toys and ornaments, video / audio CDs / DVDs, film magazines, posters etc. to School.
- 10. Students are responsible for cleanliness of their School campus in general and their classrooms in particular.
- 11. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against students who resort to unfair means in examinations.
- 12. A student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance in an academic session to be eligible to write the annual examination.
- 13. A student is required to maintain silence in the corridors while moving from one class to another.
- 14. Students are required to adopt an exemplary deportment and behavior outside the School. Their conduct and manner will reflect not only good breeding but also bring a good name to the School.

#### **DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

- 1. Unsatisfactory progress in studies, willful damage to school property, immorality, grave insubordination and contempt of authority are sufficient reasons for student's immediate dismissal from the school.
- 2. Those who cause any damage to school property will be fined as per the discretion of the school authorities.
- 3. Students who involve themselves in any misbehavior or misconduct will be served warning letter for doing so, with due information to the parents.
- 4. Recurrence of the misbehavior or misconduct will lead to the student's immediate suspension from the school.
- 5. If the misbehavior or misconduct still persists, the student will be expelled from the school without further notice.
